GENERAL EVALUATION CRITERIA

The student's evaluation will be carried out according to a final written test and a continuous evaluation. 50% of the final grade will correspond to a continuous evaluation that includes participatory class attendance, the completion of assignments and practical activities, and the partial control tests. 50% of the final grade will come from a final exam. In extraordinary calls, the continuous evaluation is not recoverable, therefore only 50% corresponding to the final exam can be recovered.

SPECIFIC CRITERIA FOR EVALUATION OF THE STUDENT OF THE ONLINE MODALITY

The evaluation of the student will be carried out according to a final written test and a continuous evaluation. In the online student there are some differential features Continuous assessment

50% of the final grade will correspond to a continuous evaluation that has the following characteristics. The continuous evaluation includes the following activities to be carried out during the course with its corresponding assessment percentage:

- 1) Elaboration of definitions on key concepts of the subject In these works, students must reflect on the basic concepts of the subject and carry out a bibliography search and definition. Up to 15 percentage points on 50% of the continuous evaluation.
- 2) Participation in the Forum of the subject. The students must form groups to carry out a discussion work on a current topic that will be proposed in advance. Up to 15 percentage points on 50% of the continuous evaluation.
- 3) Final Work. Students have to carry out work on a topic proposed by the teacher. Up to 20 percentage points on 50% of the continuous evaluation.

Final presential exam

50% of the total score of the subject corresponds to a final presential exam to be held at the University of Alicante where the theoretical and / or practical contents of the subject will be addressed.

STUDENTS WHO ENROLL FOR THE SECOND TIME AND FOLLOWING.

The student who enrolls for the second time in the subject (and following) is a new student for all purposes and has to develop the entire classroom, the assessment as the rest of the first-enrollment students. Therefore, 50% of the final grade will correspond to a continuous assessment and 50% of the final grade will come from a final exam.

The student who enrolls for the second time in the subject (and following) cannot argue that the subject's schedule overlaps with that of others because it is the responsibility of the student, in view of the schedules, to enroll in subjects with different schedules.

The student who enrolls for the second time in the subject (and following) cannot argue that due to the schedule of other subjects they must enter after or leave before the start of class. It is the responsibility of the student, in view of the schedules, to give enough margin for transfers within the campus.
